HE LANDS coloured for each name indicate general spheres of softweep, usually about the time of King James VI but taking the history of each district or family as a white. Numbers on the map indicate smaller areas or former seans held by the name whose diel's Arms in the maps are marked with the same number.

HE ARMS, effected insignite of the chiefe, may only be used by them when recorded in Lyon Regimer. In other cases, the chiefe' Arms of old can only be reconstructed from the differenced versions recorded by their conviving sades or from accionst accordat. Such Arms, here marked with an actionst, sensort to berne by anybody used the Lord Lyon determines who is the rightful chief.

HE CRESTS are the enddens on the top of the helicits.
When encoded by a composed-double bearing the chief's montoer dispars, his Crest may be weren as a Budge by all of his name
or dan. Also, they may second versions of his Arms with some mark
of difference determined for them by the Lord Lyon Nong of Arms.
